The Torrington City Council met in regular session on Tuesday, February 16th, 2016 in the City Council Chambers at 436 East 22nd Ave. at 7:00 p.m. Present: Mayor Varney, Council Members Adams, Hill, Kelly and Law. Also Present: Clerk/Treasurer Strecker, Attorney Eddington, Chief of Police Sharp, Engineer Juve, Building Official Estes, Streets and Sanitation Supervisor Korell, Electrical Supervisor Youtz, Water/Wastewater Supervisor Troxel and Deputy City Clerk Kinnan.

Mayor Varney called the meeting to order.

Councilman Adams led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Varney announced the Wyoming Association of Municipalities Winter Workshop was going to be held in Cheyenne from February 17th through the 19th.

Councilwoman Hill moved and Councilman Law seconded to approve the consent agenda which includes the minutes of the 02-02-16 Council meeting as published and all actions therein be ratified. Motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Adams moved and Councilman Kelly seconded to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Patrick Zimmerer with Table Mountain Vineyards LLC has requested approval of a catering permit for a Business after Hours Event at North Platte Physical Therapy at 1301 East M St. on February 25th from 3:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Councilman Adams moved and Councilman Law seconded to approve the catering permit as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Attorney Eddington read by title AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND RE-ENACTING SECTION 3.04.050 H. OF THE TORRINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE, 2016 REVISIONS, RELATING TO SANITATION FEES. Councilwoman Hill moved and Councilman Kelly seconded to approve Ordinance No. 1159 on third reading. Motion carried unanimously.

Attorney Eddington read by title AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND RE-ENACTING SECTION 5.12.070 OF THE TORRINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE, 2016 REVISIONS, RELATING TO MISCELLANEOUS RESTRICTIONS. The ordinance clarifies that a person, firm, or corporation owning ten percent of an existing liquor license of any category shall not be permitted to apply for a second liquor license of any category other than a malt beverage permit, catering permit, or a restaurant liquor license. He commented this will only pertain to local licensing; an applicant for example could have a retail license in Laramie, Cheyenne and Torrington. Councilman Adams moved and Councilwoman Hill seconded to approve the ordinance on first reading. Motion carried unanimously.

Electrical Supervisor Youtz presented the bid results for the Cold Springs Substation Power Transformer. He stated Staff recommended awarding the Base Bid for the transformer, manufactured by Virginia Transformer, to Western United Electric Supply Corporation of Brighton CO in the amount of \$195,361 plus an additional \$2,875 for a manufacturer's five year extended warranty for a total contract amount of \$198,236. He commented the new substation will upgrade the electrical system that feeds South Torrington. Councilman Law moved and Councilman Kelly seconded to award the bid to Western United Electric Supply Corporation as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Attorney Eddington read by title AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND RE-ENACTING SECTION 18.16.020 OF THE TORRINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE, 2016 REVISIONS, RELATING TO THE CITY OF TORRINGTON, WYOMING, AMENDING THE ZONING DISTRICT MAP BY AMENDING "C-5" ZONING TO "R-3" ZONING FOR A TRACT OF LAND. Councilwoman Hill moved and Councilman Adams seconded to approve Ordinance No. 1160 on third reading as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Varney opened the public hearing concerning liquor license renewals, variances, and a preliminary plat.

Mayor Varney read the list of Retail Liquor License applicants. The retail applicants were: 77 Capital Corp./Spirits of 77, Old Grey Fox Inc./Main Street Saloon, Caroline Garcia/ La Familia Prado, Panhandle Coop Association/Main Street Liquor, Chugwater Brewing Co. Inc./J & B Liquor, City of Torrington/Country Club, GQ LLC/Broncho Bar, Pamela J. Delgado-Garcia/Garcia's Mexican Restaurant, KCAS LLC/Thrifty's Gas & Liquor, Maverik Inc. /Maverik Store #293, Henry Duane Schaneman/Hi Way Package Liquor, The Cigarette Store Corp/Smoker Friendly-Gasamat, and Torrington Hospitality LLC/Holiday Inn Express. Mayor Varney asked Chief of Police Sharp if there were any complaints or citations against any of the applicants. Chief of Police Sharp stated there were three violations for serving alcohol to a minor, two at J & B Liquor and one at Hi Way Package Liquor. Attorney Eddington stated the offenders are always prosecuted. Chief of Police Sharp commented the business owners are notified of the violations. Councilman Kelly inquired about citing the license holder as well as the server. Attorney Eddington stated the problem with doing that would be a disgruntled employee could intentionally set their employer up to receive a citation. Mayor Varney asked for public comments for or against the renewal of the retail liquor licenses, none were heard. Councilman Law moved and Councilwoman Hill seconded to approve the renewal of the Retail Liquor Licenses as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Varney presented for approval the renewal of a Bar and Grill Liquor License to Haydee Grimes/Grampa Chuys. Mayor Varney asked for public comments for or against the renewal of the bar and grill license, none were heard. Councilwoman Hill moved and Councilman Law seconded to approve the renewal of the Bar and Grill Liquor License as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Varney read the list of Limited Club Liquor License applicants. The Club applicants were: Elks BPO 1726/Elks 1726, Moose Lodge #664/Moose Lodge #664, and the Travis Snow Post 5/American Legion Club. Mayor Varney asked for public comments for or against the renewal of the limited club licenses, none were heard. Councilwoman Hill moved and Councilman Kelly seconded to approve the renewal of the Limited Club Liquor Licenses as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Varney read the list of Restaurant Liquor License applicants. The Restaurant applicants were: Daniel & Tracine Bevans/Deacon's Restaurant, Debora Quest/Broncho Grillhouse, and Pizza Hut of Torrington Inc./Pizza Hut. Mayor Varney asked for public comments for or against the renewal of the restaurant licenses, none were heard. Chief of Police Sharp stated there was one violation for serving alcohol to a minor at Deacons. Councilman Kelly moved and Councilman Law seconded to approve the renewal of the Restaurant Liquor Licenses as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Varney convened the Council as a Board of Adjustment.

Building Official Estes stated Kurt Evezich has submitted a preliminary plat for his 4K's Subdivision located at 1210 West C St. Mr. Evezich wants to change the zoning to commercial so he can build storage units at the site. Jeremy Grooms with Benchmark of Torrington addressed the Council. He stated Mr. Evezich wants to create one lot at the site. Building Official Estes commented there have been some drainage issues at the site which will be addressed once the final designs are done and the elevations are established. He stated the Planning Commission approved the plat at their 02-09-16 meeting, Staff recommends approval and Raymond Carbajal, who owns property directly north of the area, wrote a letter in favor of the project. Mayor Varney asked for public comments for or against the preliminary plat, none were heard. Councilman Adams moved and Councilwoman Hill seconded to approve the preliminary plat as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Building Official Estes stated Thomas Wecas at 635 East 20th Ave. has requested a setback variance on the east side of the property from the required 25' to 21' for an addition. He stated the Planning Commission approved the variance at their 02-09-16 meeting, Staff also recommends approval, and there have been no comments from the neighbors. Mr. Wecas addressed the Council. He stated he wants a variance for a 700 sq. ft. addition to his home that will face toward East F Street. Councilman Kelly inquired if the addition would create any site line issues. Building Official Estes stated no, it would not. Mayor Varney asked for public comments for or against the variance, none were heard. Councilman Adams moved and Councilwoman Hill seconded to approve the setback variance for Mr. Wecas as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Building Official Estes stated Thomas Wecas at 635 East 20th Ave. has requested a square footage increase variance for an accessory structure on the west side of the home. Mr. Wecas wants to build a detached garage. He stated the Planning Commission approved the variance at their 02-09-16 meeting, Staff also recommends approval, and there have been no comments from the neighbors. Building Official Estes stated the garage will be 1600 square feet, but the current ordinance would only allow 700 square feet in this instance. Building Official Estes stated the ordinance is in place so no one will fill their entire lot. Mr. Wecas stated the east end of his property will have grass. Mayor Varney asked for public comments for or against the variance, none were heard. Councilman Law moved and Councilman Kelly seconded to approve the square footage increase variance for Mr. Wecas as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Building Official Estes stated Vision Communications Inc. has requested a variance to the zoning in C-3H (Central Business Historic District) to allow a telecommunication tower no taller than 25' on top of the building located at 2001 Main St. He stated the Planning Commission approved the variance at their 02-09-16 meeting, Staff also recommends approval, and there have been no public comments. Mayor Varney asked for public comments for or against the variance, none were heard. Councilman Kelly stated the proposed ordinance states the tower cannot exceed 15 feet. Building Official Estes stated Visionary Communications did not think the tower would be taller than 15 feet but wanted approval of 25 feet just in case. Greg Worthen with Visionary Communications addressed the Council. He stated he does not think they will need more than a 15 foot tower but asked for 25 feet as a maximum height. The concern was if the tower fell over that it would not go over the edge of the building, because the building is 50 feet wide a tower 25 feet tall could be placed in the center of the building without any danger of it falling off. Building Official Estes commented this would be a variance to the proposed ordinance. Councilman Adams moved Councilman Law seconded to approve the variance for the telecommunication tower as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Varney closed the public hearing.

Attorney Eddington read by title AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND RE-ENACTING SECTION 18.16.020 OF THE TORRINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE, 2016 REVISIONS, RELATING TO THE CITY OF TORRINGTON, WYOMING, AMENDING THE ZONING DISTRICT MAP BY ESTABLISHING "I-1" ZONING FOR

A TRACT OF LAND. Councilman Law moved and Councilman Kelly seconded to approve Ordinance No. 1161 on third reading as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Attorney Eddington read by title A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION OF A FEDERAL MINERAL ROYALTY CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION ACCOUNT GRANT APPLICATION TO THE STATE LOAN AND INVESTMENT BOARD ON BEHALF OF THE GOVERNING BODY FOR THE CITY OF TORRINGTON FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTION STORM SEWER AND DETENTION POND IMPROVEMENTS. Engineer Juve stated this application has changed significantly from the first application because Eastern Wyoming College has agreed to complete payment in full of their portion of the project therefore reducing the grant amount from \$640,036.24 to \$194,242.63. Mayor Varney stated this project will improve the drainage from Eastern Wyoming College and the North West section of Torrington. Councilwoman Hill moved and Councilman Adams seconded to approve Resolution No. 2016-04 as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Attorney Eddington read by title AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND RE-ENACTING SUB-SECTION C. OF SECTION 15.20.040 OF THE TORRINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE, 2016 REVISIONS, RELATING TO GENERAL REQUIREMENTS. Building Official Estes stated that a telecommunication tower is not allowed in a C-3H zone (Central Business Historic District). He stated the Planning Commission approved the variance at their 02-09-16 meeting, Staff also recommends approval, and there have been no public comments. The proposed ordinance would permit telecommunication towers in the Central Business Historic District. Councilman Law moved and Councilman Kelly seconded to approve the ordinance on first reading. Motion carried unanimously.

Attorney Eddington read by title AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND RE-ENACTING SECTION 18.16.020 OF THE TORRINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE, 2016 REVISIONS, RELATING TO THE CITY OF TORRINGTON, WYOMING, AMENDING THE ZONING DISTRICT MAP BY ESTABLISHING "C-2" ZONING FOR A TRACT OF LAND. Building Official Estes stated the ordinance will amend the zoning district map by amending "R-6" (Multi Family Dwellings) to "C-2" (Commercial) zoning for Kurt Evezich's property at 1210 West C Street. He stated the Planning Commission approved the zone change at their 02-09-16 meeting and Staff recommends approval. Councilman Adams moved and Councilwoman Hill seconded to approve the ordinance on first reading. Motion carried unanimously.

Attorney Eddington read by title AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND RE-ENACTING SECTION 18.16.020 OF THE TORRINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE, 2016 REVISIONS, RELATING TO THE CITY OF TORRINGTON, WYOMING, AMENDING THE ZONING DISTRICT MAP BY ESTABLISHING "R-4" ZONING FOR A TRACT OF LAND. Building Official Estes stated Vicki Zimmer, DBA BZ Properties has requested a zone change from an R-3 (Two Family Dwellings) to an R-4 (Multi Family Dwellings) for 2101 East C Street. She wants to remodel the property for apartments. The Planning Commission did not approve the zone change at their 02-09-16 meeting. A letter against the rezoning was received from Nathan Kendall the owner/resident of 2102 East C Street. Building Official Estes stated BZ Properties has also submitted a second application for a variance to the required number of off street parking spaces required for the apartment project if the re-zoning is approved. Maria Shores residing at 2109 East C St. addressed the Council. She stated she is against the zone change because it would increase traffic and she is concerned for the safety of the children in the neighborhood. Ms. Shores stated she lives next door to the property and voiced concerns about parking and increased noise. Sheri Yorges residing at 2118 East C St. addressed the Council. She stated she has lived in the neighborhood for nine years and chose the location because it was a safe area for children. She is concerned with parking and increased traffic issues, with the Police Dept., Sheriff's Office, and ambulance service only a block away she feels it will create problems for the first responders. Councilman Kelly inquired when the property at 2101 East C was a church were there parking or traffic issues. Ms. Yorges stated it was only two hours a week so it was not a big problem. Brenda McCranie residing at 2110 East C St. addressed the Council. She spoke against the zone change, stating the street is narrow, and the added parking and traffic will cause issues for residents in the neighborhood. Vicki Zimmer residing at 701 Albany addressed the Council. She stated there is a need for reasonably priced rentals within the City. She wants to renovate the property and create four apartments which will improve the neighborhood. She commented that 21st Ave. is not an emergency route so she feels this project would not create a problem for the first responders. Ms. Zimmer commented at the Planning Commission meeting on 02-09-16 she was asked by the Commission if there was a way to create parking on the property. After researching the off street parking requirements and measuring the property she stated she has created a new plan which includes parking spaces on the south side of the lot. Councilwoman Hill stated she wanted Ms. Zimmer to submit the new plan to the Planning Commission for approval. Councilman Adams inquired if Building Official Estes had seen the new plan. Building Official Estes stated no, he had not. Attorney Eddington stated Ms. Zimmer needed to start over and submit her new plan to the Planning Commission. Councilwoman Hill moved and Councilman Adams seconded to deny the request for the zone change at 2101 East C Street. Motion carried unanimously.

The bills from 02-03-16 to 02-16-16 were presented for payment. Councilman Adams moved and Councilwoman Hill seconded to approve the bills for payment as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Kelly moved and Councilman Law seconded that there being no further business to come before the Council to adjourn at 8:15 p.m. Motion carried unanimously.
